



INSIDER TRIPS:

SIPPER

In a place with 400+ wineries and even more labels, how do you decide between them all? We suggest you pick a few and have fun. Here are our recommendations for sipping your way around Napa.

- eat:** In the morning grab a pastry at **Bouchon Bakery** and then head over to **Domain Chandon** for a glass of bubbles. Do lunch at the **Bounty Hunter Wine Bar & Smokin' BBQ**. And for an amazing dinner experience, try **La Toque**, known as one of the best restaurants for wine and food pairings in the US, thanks to Sommelier Scott Tracy and Chef Ken Frank.
- drink:** In addition to your vineyard visits, stop in at the wine shop at **Dean and Deluca**. For the collector who wants to purchase a case, contact Wine Director Mark Mendenhall for a private tasting.
- play:** Isn't all of this play? You are in the playground of the wine gods!
- pack:** Be sure to bring an extra corkscrew, and a small notebook for your tasting notes.
- note:** Try out a winery co-op that features at least 10 different wineries. Small and under the radar, most of these wines never leave our Valley. **Silenus**, located less than three miles from the hotel, is a great one to visit. Be sure to call Scott Turnnidge first to make an appointment. Ask for Poem Cellars by name!
